- Household hazardous waste (paint, chemicals, pesticides, herbicides, cleaners, thinners, aerosol cans, automotive fluids, batteries, fluorescent tubes, etc.)
- Electronics (television, computer, computer monitor, CRTs, separated circuit boards)
- Pharmaceuticals
- Sharps
- Appliances

# Second Street and Lincoln Avenue Traffic Signal Project

## Construction Almost Complete

The City is pleased to announce that construction on the Second Street and Lincoln Avenue Traffic Signal Project is nearing completion.

The City was awarded two grants for the construction of this project, one from a federal grant through the Puget Sound Regional Council and the other through the Washington State Pedestrian and Bicycle Program. Over 90% of the construction costs will be funded by these grants.

Over the next few days, the contractor will be installing traffic loops and luminaires and completing the striping and signing installation. The traffic signal turn on is scheduled for April 17<sup>th</sup> and once initiated, the intersection will become fully operational. Traffic delays and temporary lane closures should be anticipated until such time. Soon Centennial Trail Users can enjoy a safer crossing of Second Street.
