Beware of Telephone Scam!

The Snohomish Police Department has received information regarding a telephone scam being perpetrated on City residents. The following information is being provided in an attempt to educate our community so as to avoid anyone becoming a victim of these scammers.

The telephone scam works like this; the suspect calls your home with a caller ID of (360) 568-0888. That phone number is the main number for the Snohomish Police Department. The caller states there is an issue with your citizenship and you have until a specific time to take care of the problem before the Snohomish Police Department becomes involved. The caller will offer to take care of the issue for you over the phone for a fee before the police department becomes involved. **NONE OF THIS IS TRUE. THIS IS A SCAM.**

Here is the information the Police Department has obtained regarding this fraud. The callback number provided by the caller is 844-298-6928. The caller claims to be from US Legal Support. They provide a fake case number of D 742936 and the name given was Jeff Marten. The Police Department did call this number and spoke with an unidentified male who asked for payment to be made using a debit card or a pre-paid cash card. When the Police Department identified themselves to the male, the phone call was abruptly ended.

The Snohomish Police Department wants everyone know that law enforcement does not call anyone on the phone threatening to arrest them because of their citizenship status and we do not ask for payment over the phone. Additionally, if anyone provides a debit card number to someone over the phone, there is no way to quickly stop any fraudulent activity and your bank will most likely not cover any losses you may suffer. Your bank account could be emptied before you realize what has happened.

If you, or someone you know, has been the victim of such a scam and it has not been reported to law enforcement that needs to happen right away. If you do receive such a call, hang up right away. These individuals mean to cause you harm and you have the right to end the contact quickly. If you are uncertain about the caller's intentions, you can let them know you will call them back once you have discussed the matter with the Police Department. If they are legitimate, they will provide you with a callback number. You can then call the Police Department and discuss this with an officer. The non-emergency phone number for reporting this type of activity is (425) 407-3999. Always be safe and question anything you do not understand.

Comprehensive Plan Amendment/Rezone Application Deadline is Approaching

Proposed changes by the public to the Comprehensive Plan and Land Use Designation Map (rezone) and development regulations are processed on an annual cycle. The deadline to submit an application for this year's cycle is March 31, 2017. Applications of proposed changes will be forwarded to the City Council for consideration to be placed on the 2017 docket. Proposed changes placed on the docket will undergo a detailed analysis by staff and will be reviewed and processed as required by City code. There will be several opportunities for community input throughout the process, including public hearings before the Planning Commission and the City Council. Proposals placed on the docket will ultimately be considered by the City Council at the end of the year for potential implementation in 2018.
