## Customer Utility Bill Payments Stolen From City Hall Drop Box

The City of Snohomish utility payment drop box near City Hall was broken into over the weekend of April 8-9 and customer utility payments appear to have been stolen.

City staff discovered the break-in on the morning of April 10. Any customers who put payments in the box between April 7 and early morning April 10 should contact City Hall to see if your payment was received. Please call (360) 568-3115.

Any customers whose payments are missing are urged to contact your bank immediately. The City will reimburse you for any bank fees resulting from account closures or check holds related to the payment theft.

So far, the City has reached out to a dozen customers whose payments appear to have been stolen. Their opened payment envelopes were found scattered on two City walking trails on April 10.

Utility payments dropped off to the box before April 7 are not affected by the break-in.

The drop box will remain closed until it can be repaired or replaced. In the meantime, customers can either mail their payments, come into City Hall to deliver payment directly, or pay online (see below).

## Convenience Fee Removed for Online Utility Bill Payments

As a reminder, there is now **NO FEE** to pay your utility bill online using a debit or credit card or from a bank account via e-check.
