Averill Youth Complex Site Deed Restriction Discussion on Council's Agenda

At its June 6, 2017 meeting, the City Council will discuss deed restrictions. The meeting starts at 7:00 p.m. in the George Gilbertson Boardroom at 1601 Avenue D.

There will be a general discussion about what deed restrictions are. There will also be a specific discussion about the status of deed restrictions on the Averill Youth Complex site west of Pine Avenue between Second and Third Streets. The Snohomish Boys & Girls Club, Skate Park, Tillicum Kiwanis playground, and Hal Moe Pool building are located on the site.

During the presentation, staff will summarize the history of deed restrictions on the site. Staff will also describe how deed restrictions work. Part of the discussion will address the feasibility and advisability of restoring deeds restrictions that have been removed.


Hal Moe Building Advisory Committee Meeting

2017 First Street and Lincoln Avenue Utility Project

The City's 2017 First Street and Lincoln Avenue Utility Project is currently out for public bid and is expected to begin in mid-June. The project will involve replacing old infrastructure, including 80-year old water mains in First Street and Lincoln Avenue, and an aging sewer force main in Lincoln Avenue. Construction is expected to be completed in September. **Expect traffic delays.**
