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NOTICE OF APPLICATION AND DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE (DNS) Wastewater Treatment Plant Air Gaps Shoreline Permit File # SL21-0003

Proposal Name: WWTP Air Gap Project (City file no. SL21-0003)

Proponent: City of Snohomish Public Works Department

Description of Proposal: Install two air gap facilities at the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant to protect the water system from contamination. Each facility will include a 500-gallon poly tank and associated piping, valves, and pumps. One facility will be located near the headworks at the northern end of the site within a new, 240-square-foot structure, and the other will be in the southeast corner of the property, within an existing structure.

Location of Proposal: 2115 Second Street, on Snohomish County tax parcel 28051300201800, in the NW quarter of Section 13, Township 28 N, Range 05 E, W.M.

Public Hearing: No public hearing is required for this land use application.

City Permits and/or Actions Required for the Development: Shoreline Permit; Building Permit.

Threshold Determination: The lead agency for this proposal has determined that it does not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment. The requirements for environmental analysis, protection, and mitigation measures have been adequately addressed in the development regulations and comprehensive plans adopted under chapter 36.70A RCW, and in other applicable local, state, or federal laws or rules, as provided by RCW 43.21C.240 and WAC 197-11-158. An environmental impact statement (EIS) is not required under RCW 43.21C.030(2)(c). This decision was made after review of a completed environmental checklist, applicable regulations, and other information on file with the City of Snohomish. This information is available for review. APPEALS: Unless withdrawn or revised pursuant to comments received within the comment period above, this Determination of Non-Significance shall be final on April 20, 2021. Appeals of this SEPA threshold determination must be filed in writing with the City Clerk for the City of Snohomish by 4:00 p.m. on **April 20, 2021**. Appeals must be made in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 14.20 SMC. A \$500 appeal fee must be filed with the appeal. Appeals must be in writing and received as original documents by the close of the appeal period. Fax, e-mail and similar forms of document transmission shall not be accepted and shall not be considered as meeting the filing requirements. Appeals must state the section of the SMC being appealed, the specific determination or mitigation being appealed and the form of relief requested.
