



Inspection Checklist Business Pollution Prevention

Review this checklist and implement these practices to prepare for your inspection. Your inspector will use items on this checklist to determine if your business is in compliance with Snohomish City Code and Department of Ecology permit requirements.

Good Housekeeping

- Dumpster lids are closed when not in use.
- Dumpster area is swept regularly and kept free of litter and spills.
- Water from pressure washing, mopping, floor mats, equipment cleaning etc. —is collected and disposed into an indoor drain.
- Parking lot is kept clean of litter and free of oil and grease.

Chemical Storage

- Chemicals are stored undercover, off the ground, and away from storm drains.
- No chemicals are used to clean the outside of the building/property.
- Chemicals are protected from rain and vehicles.

Spills

- A spill kit is available for employees to use.
- Your spill kit is refilled after every use.
- A Spill Plan is written and available for employees to reference.
- Spills are contained then immediately cleaned up.

Private Storm System

- Storm drains and other storm drainage structures are inspected and cleaned regularly.
- Storm drains are labeled with “drains to stream” markers.

The intent of implementing these practices and others found in the Stormwater Management Manual for Western Washington is to prevent pollution from mixing with rain then flowing into Snohomish’s streams, lakes, and wetlands.
