PROCLAMATION

A PROCLAMATION OF THE CITY OF SNOHOMISH RECOGNIZING APRIL AS CONSERVATION MONTH

WHEREAS, the City of Snohomish is located at the confluence of the Pilchuck and Snohomish Rivers, the ancestral home of the *Sdoh-doh-hohbsh*, and an area that is both ecologically diverse and abundant in natural wonders; and

WHEREAS, the City has been proactively working with government and non-governmental agencies to help restore more than 1,700 acres of the Snohomish River's estuary; and

WHEREAS, the City is host to the biannual Historic Snohomish Tree Tour and conservation-minded groups such as Green Snohomish and the Garden Club; and

WHEREAS, the Snohomish City Council has adopted Fostering Environmental Resiliency and Sustainability as a Council Goal for 2023-24; and

WHEREAS, each year, Earth Day is celebrated on April 22 and the last Friday of April is generally recognized as National Arbor Day; and

WHEREAS, this April, the City of Snohomish will host several conservation-themed events, including: a Litter Walk on April 1, the annual Garbage and Recycle Event on April 15, an Earth Day celebration on April 22, and an Arbor Day Planting at Pilchuck Julia Landing on April 29;

NOW, THEREFORE, I Linda Redmon, Mayor of Snohomish, on behalf of the City Council, do hereby proclaim April 2023 as

CONSERVATION MONTH


